#### Can you visualize an offense like a rock that is thrown at you?







The rock that was thrown at you in the form of an offense –

Throw it back at the person – **vindication**.

Hold on to it – grudge or bitterness.

- Lay it at the feet of Jesus.

The one thing the enemy uses most often is holding on to the offense, and it manifests itself in **unforgiveness, holding grudges** or **developing a root of bitterness**.

#### **Payback – Seeking Patterns**

- Our attempts at paying people back do not take away the issue at hand.
- When we try to pay people back it never eases our pain, it only extends it.

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#### Things to do before you payback.

Pause	Pausing helps give us distance from the intensity of a situation and clarity on how we should respond.
Pray	Prayer is the key to getting results.
Ponder	A plan can often save you from regret from a hasty payback.

Pursuing revenge at all cost and using our preferred method.


#### Vindication

#### Faulty *If 1:* If I do right, things will go right for me.

Are you the rule follower?

- Follow the **program**.
- Follow the **formula**.
- Follow the <u>recipes</u>.

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## **God Knows** the Vindication You Seek Chapter 3

#### Faulty If 2: If I am kind, people will behave kindly toward me.

Are you **disappointed**, **indigent**, or **offended** when you are kind or generous to others and they do not return the favor?

We should do unto others as we would want them to do unto us, but with the understanding they may not.

#### What if:

- We are **kind**, they aren't **kind** back.
- We are good friends, and they are **lousy** to us.
- We are honest with them, and they **lie** to us.

#### Remember ... God knows.

# His knowledge of our situation brings a protective factor that has a way of bringing false information to light.

**Chapter 3** 

#### Understanding the difference between forgiveness and reconciliation.

Forgiveness	Reconciliation
Focuses on the offense.	Focuses on the relationship.
Does not require relationship.	Requires a relationship in which two people, in agreement are working together toward the same goal.

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#### **Chapter 3**

Forgiveness	Reconciliation
Can take place with only one person.	Requires two people.
Is directed one way.	Is reciprocal, occurring two ways.
Is a decision to release the offender.	Is the effort to rejoin the offender.
Involves a change in thinking about the offender.	Involves a change in behavior by the offender.
Is a free gift to the one who has broken trust.	Is a restored relationship based on restored trust.
Is extended even if it is never earned.	Is offered to the offender because it has been earned.
Is unconditional, regardless of a lack of repentance.	Is conditional based on the offender's repentance.
